October is upon us, and so comes with it a seasonal display of God's artistry of changing colors and leaves! It also happens to be my favorite month of the year. I hope you and yours can find some time to embrace all this soon-to-arrive vibrancy of color. The frost will soon be on the pumpkin, a Jack O' Lantern on the porch, and may your fall festivities be joyfully meandering like a corn maze!

There is also plenty happening in the life of our church this month, so do take a close read of the rest of the newsletter! For my part, I wanted to share a bit more about what will be happening on Wednesday nights with the Circle of Friends adult study. We are calling the adult study "Oktoberfest," and it will be three Wednesday nights: October 18, 25, and November 1. The topic for these three gatherings will be the Reformation!

Though the Reformation happened in 1517 with German monk Martin Luther nailing 95 statements or "theses" to the church door in Wittenberg, Germany, the Reformation still plays a tremendous role in our expressions of faith, church structure, creeds, and how we read scripture. For our first gathering **on Wednesday, October 18,** we'll consider the Reformation more generally, introduce some key players and themes in the movement, and explore modern parallels of how the church is still and always will be "reforming."

For the second gathering **on Wednesday, October 25**, we will be looking at Martin Luther specifically and why he felt called to offer his critiques of the Catholic Church during his time. To go further than my limited Presby-terian understanding of Martin Luther, we are calling in an expert on Luther and a guest teacher to lead our discussion! The discussion will be led by a close friend of Salem Presbyterian, Rev. David Drebes, who is the minister at College Lutheran church right next door. What better way to learn about Martin Luther than from a dyed-in-the-wool Lutheran?

Oh, but there is more! As October 25 is the week before Halloween, Pastor David will be looking at Martin Luther's thoughts on exorcisms (and Luther did have them) as a way to introduce us to what Luther thought more broadly about the Reformation. Just in time for Halloween, we'll be hearing the spookier side of Luther! Though exorcisms and demons aside, the scariest phrase for the rampant corrupt church leaders in the church during Luther's day would have been Luther's new slogans, "By faith alone, by grace alone, and by scripture alone." **On Wednesday, November 1st,** we'll conclude with looking at second generation reformers like our very own John Calvin.

Lastly, to conclude our Oktoberfest festivities, we will celebrate all things Reformation in worship on Sunday, October 29. If all goes as planned, we will have a bagpiper in worship that Sunday to pay homage to our branch of the Reformation which largely came out of Scotland with folks like John Knox.

To cap it all off, on that same Reformation Sunday, **Sunday October 29, at 4:00 PM we are having a "theology on tap" at Olde Salem Brewery.** If you've never heard of a "theology on tap," they have grown in popularity the last many years. The idea is to meet at a brewery to have a time of fellowship and discuss theology for around an hour. Indeed many a creed and confession has been formed around a pint, however if beer or alcohol is not your thing that is perfectly fine as well. Feel free to still come and join the fellowship and discussion. Since "theology on tap" is technically a trademarked phrase already, we'll be calling our brewery gathering "Calvin and Hops."

It will be big Reformation fun this month, and be it through our Wednesday night gatherings, or worship service by the time we get to November, we'll all hopefully know just a little bit more about church history and these Reformation giants in their day.

# **SUNDAY SCHOOL** Sundays at 9:30 AM

Our Sunday School classes are off to a good start and there is a class for everyone! The classes are structured to reach different audiences and engage people in different ways. All of the classes are from 9:30-10:30 AM, followed by a fellowship time before 11:00 worship. Find your class . . . and invite someone to join you!

Nursery—Bible stories, play time, and activities Children (Kindergarten-5<sup>th</sup> grade)—Active lessons about Bible stories (Sparkhouse Lectionary)

Youth (6<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade)—Connections with the Scriptures. Each week, four scriptures are suggested for worship. This class will explore the relationships between the scriptures and what they are saying for us today.

#### Adults

- Disciple—"Christian Believer: Knowing God with Heart and Mind" will help students to understand the scriptures more deeply and live out God's Word in their lives. There are daily readings and many participants in this class volunteer to teach several sessions.

## **UNDER PRESSURE** Understanding Blood Pressure

High blood pressure, also known as hypertension, is the most common cardiovascular disease in the U.S. and affects an estimated 50 to70 million Americans! It is often referred to as *the silent killer* because those afflicted rarely experience any warning signs or symptoms.

<u>What's in a Number?</u> A blood pressure (BP) reading is represented as two numbers that measure the force of blood pushing against the artery vessel walls. The first and higher number is a gauge of systolic pressure, or the pressure in the arteries when the heart beats and expands the vessels by filling them with blood. The second number assesses diastolic pressure, or the pressure in the arteries when the heart is at rest between beats. Both are equally important and should be evaluated if elevated.

What is "Normal" Blood Pressure? At birth, we typically have a BP of approximately 90/60 (verbalized as 90 over 60) which gradually rises to about 120/80 in a healthy adult. However, if you were to measure your BP right after an aerobic workout or important exam, it would probably appear high. Remember, it is normal for blood pressure to vary depending on physical exertion, emotional state, or stress. But when BP is consistently elevated, 140/90 and above, taken on 2 separate occasions, seek treatment. High blood pressure increases your risk for heart attack, heart failure, stroke, kidney damage, blindness and dementia.

There are several classifications of blood pressure including:

- Normal: Less than 120/80
- **Prehypertension:** 120/80 to 139/89
- Stage 1 high blood pressure: 140/90 to 159/99
- Stage 2 high blood pressure: 160/100 and above

<u>What Can You Do?</u> *Know your blood pressure*! Have your BP checked regularly, especially if you have any of the following risk factors: diabetes, family history of heart disease, African American descent, elevated blood cholesterol, 55 years of age and over, or smoke. By making some *healthy lifestyle* changes, you can lower your blood pressure significantly. Here are some suggestions:

- Get moving- exercise regularly.
- Maintain a healthy weight.

• **Reduce salt** intake and foods high in saturated fats. Eat more fruits and vegetables.

• Manage stress- avoid stress "triggers", when possible.

• DO NOT SMOKE, limit alcohol and caffeine.

• Use caution with over-the-counter (OTC) medications such as decongestants, "diet" pills, eye drops, and NSAIDS, which increase blood pressure. Hot tubs, saunas, etc. may also cause BP to spike.

If you are under a physician's care for high blood pressure and wish to have your BP measured between office visits or would just like to know what your BP is, call the church office to schedule an appointment with me.

# **CROP HUNGER WALK**

The **CROP Hunger Walk** will be celebrating its 40<sup>th</sup> Walk in the Roanoke Valley on Sunday, October 8. CROP Hunger Walks are community-based walk fundraising events held in cities and towns across the United States, created to support the global mission of Church World Service, a faith-based organization transforming communities around the globe through just and sustainable responses to hunger, poverty, displacement and disaster. After the CROP Hunger Walk ends, 25% of the funds raised through donations and sponsorships will support local hunger fighting efforts through Community Solutions Center (an arm of Feeding Southwest Virginia). The Walk has a 1 mile and a 4 mile route through Roanoke, starting and ending at First Evangelical Presbyterian Church.

There will be Fall gleaning, the annual CROP Hunger Walk, Bible studies, Circles, and Sunday School classes. We'll be trying some new things too – more community music outreach, and a Blessing of the Animals, for example. We also continue with our wonderful congregational ministry, including vibrant worship services, Christian Education, the popular Saturday Hymn sings with Reed, Wednesday Bible studies, and more. Responding to God's abundance is limited only by our imaginations, resources, and abilities. We invite you to be a part of these wonderful opportunities!

Fall is also a time when we reflect on how we personally respond to God's abundance as well as how SPC responds as a community of faith. 
