# a note from *Chris*



Things have been abuzz around the church these last few weeks as our church is expectantly looking forward to the fall and kicking off our program year! There are many wonderful opportunities for fellowship, faith formation, Wednesday night gatherings, and a few special worship services on the horizon! Make sure to mark your calendars accordingly for some of these great opportunities to be the church together!

Two of these special worship services will be happening in the near future, including **Jazz Vespers (prayer service) on September 10 at 7:00 PM in the sanctuary, and then a “Blessing of the Animals” service on October 1 at 4:00 p.m. on the front lawn.** Many of us may have participated in these types of worship services, but since they are a little new to us as a congregation, I wanted to share a few more details of what to expect during these worship services.

Jazz music, like prayer, is a language often of few words shared between musicians and listeners in an intimate space. It is in this spirit that the idea of a “jazz vespers” has caught on as way of worship. During this service you will hear a variety of scriptures accompanied by well-known hymns in Jazz styles like ballads, funk, and swing. While this service does not have a heavy emphasis on congregational singing, each song leaves plenty of room for musical improvisation and prayer.

The intention during this time is to let the music be meditative, not a performance, but an opportunity to let your prayers wander throughout the music and improvisation. This service is also shorter, designed to conclude the day, and start the new week. Since this service is also happening on our Celebration Sunday, it’s a great way to kick off the fall. Weather permitting, we will also keep the sanctuary doors open to the street to invite the community inside the sanctuary, or to just hear the sounds of the world outside our door.

Looking further ahead, on October 1 at 4:00 PM, we are having a Blessing of the Animals worship service! While it seems like a new type of service, our faith is rooted in traditions that care deeply about the world God created and often these services coincide with St. Francis of Assisi’s life and death, dating back to year 1226. While we do not have “feast days” to venerate “saints” in our tradition like our Catholic friends understand the word, Francis is revered across traditions for the way he invited all Christians to take notice of the beautiful creation God has made which we often take for granted.

For our service on October 1, you are invited to bring a chair, and any animals that you love in your house (provided they can safely attend) to the outside service at 4:00 PM. In many ways, the service will look similar to a shorter, normal order of worship, but it will conclude with your animal family member getting a blessing, living into the words of Psalm 148, “All creation, come praise the name of the Lord!” Whether your animal friend walks on four legs, crawls, swims, flies, or dare we say it, slithers, it will receive a blessing all the same!

My hope with both of these services is that they can help us praise God in a slightly different way, inviting us into a new kind of sacred space outside of our faithful Sunday mornings. Sometimes even having a service at a different time of day in the evening and afternoon helps us encounter the “holy” in unexpected ways. The style of worship in these services might be a little different, but it will be Spirit-filled all the same!

## SUNDAY SCHOOL Sundays at 9:30 AM

There is a class for everyone! You can choose your class based on any number of categories: age group, style of leadership, topic, fellow attendees, location. All of the classes are from 9:30-10:30 AM, followed by a fellowship time before 11:00 worship. Find your class . . . and invite someone to join you!

**Nursery**—Bible stories, play time, and activities

**Children** (Kindergarten-5<sup>th</sup> grade)—Active Bible lessons

**Youth** (6<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade)—Connections with the Scriptures. Each week, four scriptures are suggested for worship. This class will explore the relationships between the scriptures and what they are saying for us today.

### Adults

**Disciple**—"Christian Believer: Knowing God with Heart and Mind" will help students to understand the scriptures more deeply and live out God's Word in their lives. There are daily readings and many participants in this class volunteer to teach several sessions.

**Kingdom Living**—"Wade in the Water," by Eric Peterson will be the first four week book study. This study will help students choose the sacred ways that form us in the Jesus Way. This class has shared leadership.

**Journey On**—"Signs and Wonders," by Amy Jill Levine will be the first study. These six classes will be based on a video and discussion, as well as concern and prayer for those in the class. No preparation is needed. Fran Ferguson will lead.

## GET THE JAB

### ‘Tis the Season to Get Vaccinated

Fall is near! The leaves will be turning color, the air will grow cooler, and the days will become shorter. We expect these changes, and if we're wise, we will also expect the reemergence of respiratory illness *and* prepare for them. That means taking advantage of all that modern medicine has to offer to keep us well. Decades of research and ongoing testing has gone into developing up-to-date flu, COVID-19, pneumonia, and the newly approved RSV vaccines. (Sidebar: New Kid in Town)

#### **Beware the Four**

We seem to have become nonchalant about seasonal respiratory illness. **Flu** has been with us for centuries, right? Yet, it has always laid a heavy burden on our healthcare system. **COVID-19** continues to bring disruption, fear, and loss of life into our midst. **Pneumonia** is often a complication of these respiratory illnesses, among others. Not so widely known **RSV**, with symptoms similar to a cold, the flu, and COVID-19, has also taken its toll on our respiratory health. Fortunately, we have vaccines and boosters to get us through this season. Besides protecting your own health and the health of those around you, getting vaccinated can decrease admissions to hospitals, as well as save precious medical supplies and equipment.

#### **Listen to the Experts**

The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) are recommending that **all persons aged 6 months and older be vaccinated for the flu by the end of October, and COVID-19 as deemed appropriate if you've had a recent vaccine or booster. A new COVID-19 booster addressing new subvariants is due in mid-September. If you have children, ask their healthcare provider which COVID-19 vaccines and/or boosters they should receive.**

\*Remember, a preexisting condition makes you even more vulnerable to COVID-19, the flu, severe illness and even death, so these vaccines may save your life.

#### **Play It Smart**

Get vaccinated for COVID-19 and the flu while practicing the following:

- **WASHING YOUR HANDS OFTEN** is the best way to guard against infection, especially after being in public places, blowing your nose, using the bathroom, coughing, or sneezing. You need to *scrub with soap and water for at least 20 seconds*, the length of time it takes to pray the Lord's Prayer. If handwashing isn't an option, use hand sanitizers containing a minimum of 60% alcohol.
- Wear a mask and/or social distance when appropriate, especially if you've had virus symptoms or are in large, close crowds of people as found in airports or other forms of public transportation.
- Avoid touching your face. Viruses may be present on unwashed hands and can enter through the nose, mouth, or eyes.
- Cough or sneeze into tissues and toss them. If that isn't possible,

ble, cough or sneeze into your elbow and wash your hands.

- Ask your healthcare provider if you are a candidate for the **pneumonia and RSV vaccines**.
- If you experience any virus symptoms, contact your healthcare provider ASAP and ask how they want to treat you. They may assess you over the phone and direct you to care accordingly. Antiviral medications can greatly reduce the severity and duration of the flu and COVID-19. *\*Do not go to the hospital Emergency Department unless your symptoms progress rapidly and/or include trouble breathing, persistent pain or pressure in the chest, new confusion, inability to wake or stay awake, or bluish lips or face.*
- Use common sense and *stay home from work or school* when you're sick! Your healthcare provider will advise you when it is safe to return to normal activities.

#### **Putting Others First**

Infants and young children, the elderly, pregnant women, and those with chronic illness or compromised immune systems are at much greater risk of getting gravely ill from both COVID-19 and the flu. As we endeavor to put into action Christ's command to "love your neighbor as yourself," being vaccinated demonstrates our care and concern for others. By doing so, we can protect our friends, family, and community.

#### **Possible Flu and COVID-19 Symptoms**

- Fever and chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath
- Headache
- Muscle aches
- Runny nose and sore throat
- Extreme weakness
- Loss of appetite
- Vomiting and diarrhea

*Difference:*

COVID-19 can cause a change in, or loss of, taste or smell.

**New this season-** egg allergies are no longer considered a deterrent for flu vaccination. All vaccines administered in a pharmacy or health care setting are monitored for allergic reactions and can be treated immediately on site.

#### **New Kid in Town**

In May, the FDA approved a new vaccine to prevent RSV (Respiratory Syncytial Virus) in individuals 60+ years of age. RSV is a highly contagious respiratory virus that can cause illness in all age groups but is potentially life-threatening to infants less than one year and seniors. Vaccines are available at your local pharmacy and may be given with other vaccines including flu, COVID-19, and pneumonia. Check with your healthcare provider to see if this may be recommended for you.

## Session met on July 25, 2023. Please note:

- Session approved the use of Salem Presbyterian Church facilities for the wedding of Catherine R. Caldwell and George P. Short, Saturday, June 1, 2024 at 5:00 PM.
- Session voted to accept SPC Review Committee's completed Financial Review Report for calendar year 2022.

- Session approved Outreach Committee requesting helpers from SPC to support Habitat's Apostles Build program on Wednesday, August 30, Friday, September 1, Wednesday, September 6, and Friday, September 8.
- Session heard from Director of Music Reed Carter about Worship Committee's proposal to consider setting up a Fine Arts Concert Series on a permanent basis at SPC along the lines of "Music on Main and Market" or something similar. The event would be held on the 1st Sunday of the month.
- Session approved setting up Olde Salem Days parking on September 9 using SPC's parking lot. Donations will be accepted from those utilizing the parking lot.

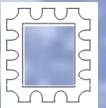
